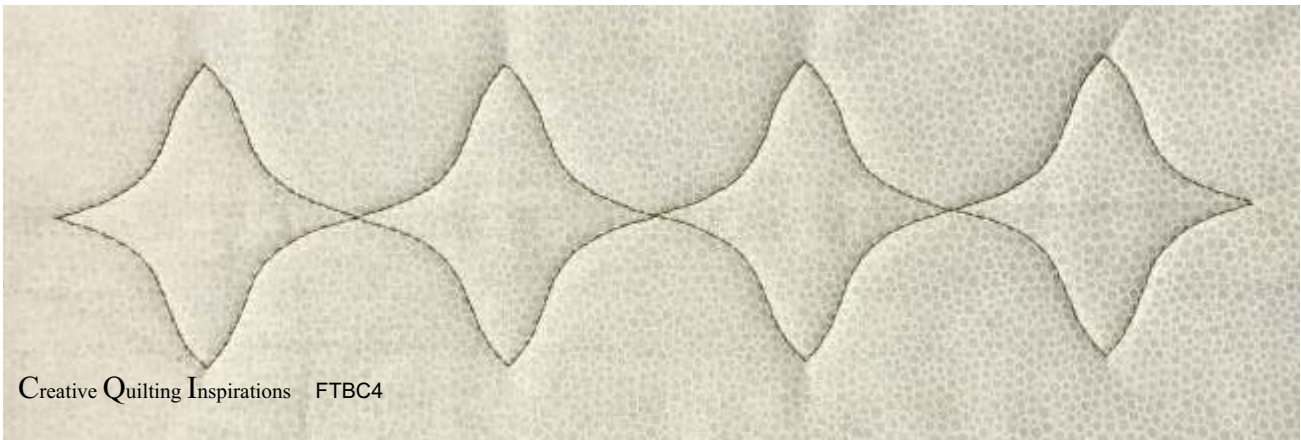
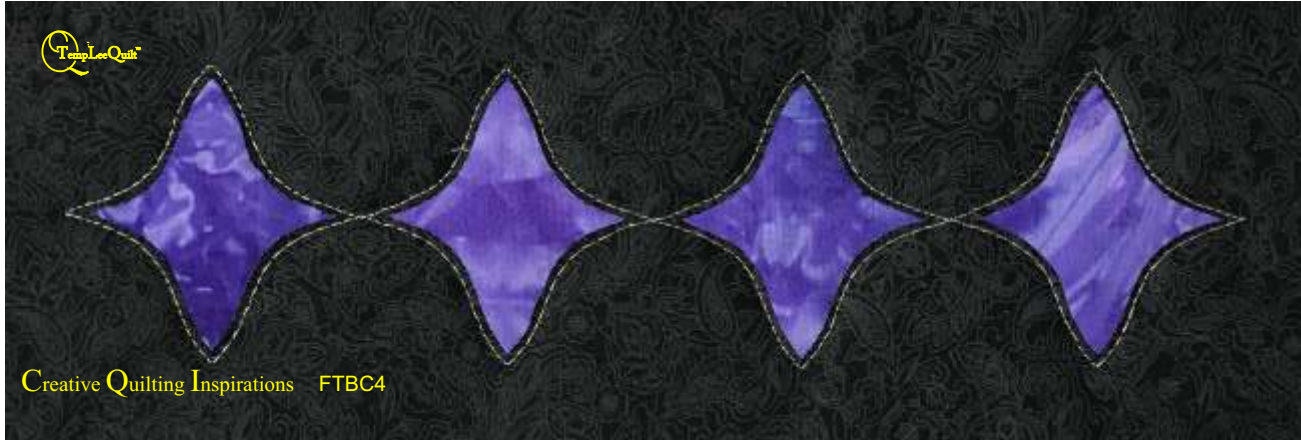

# Creative Quilting Inspiration

## London Collection FLYING BELL CURVE TRIANGLE

Quilting Design FBCT4

Westalee Design Tools used:-  
For the quilting - London Collection 2" Flying Bell Curve Triangle  
Any Westalee Straight Ruler

### Preparation Steps

Cut **14.5" x 8.5"** rectangle of Top Fabric (charcoal), Backing Fabric (cream), Batting, Feature Fabric (purple) and double sided fusible webbing.

Starch fabric before layering.

Apply double side fusible to the wrong side of the Top Fabric (charcoal)

Mark any needed **Reference Lines** before layering the fabric.

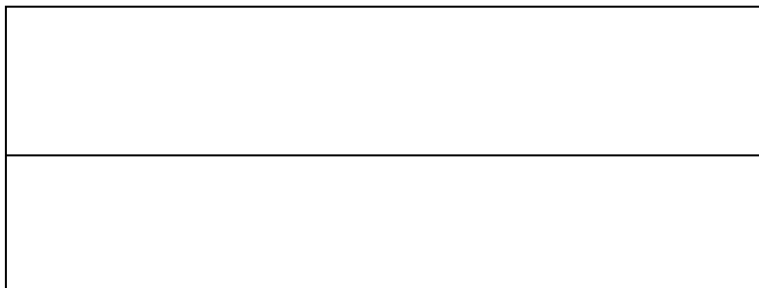
Layer the quilt sandwich - 1. Backing - 2. Batting - 3. Feature Fabric - 4. Top Fabric  
I use spray adhesive - spray very lightly.

**DO NOT PRESS until the Top Fabric has been cut away.**

Quilt the design and then cut away the **TOP FABRIC** layer (very carefully, using the photo as a reference) 2mm to 3mm from the quilting stitches. I use a fine seam ripper to make a small incision in the **Top Fabric** and good pair of duck bill scissors to cut away the **Top Fabric**.

### Reference Lines

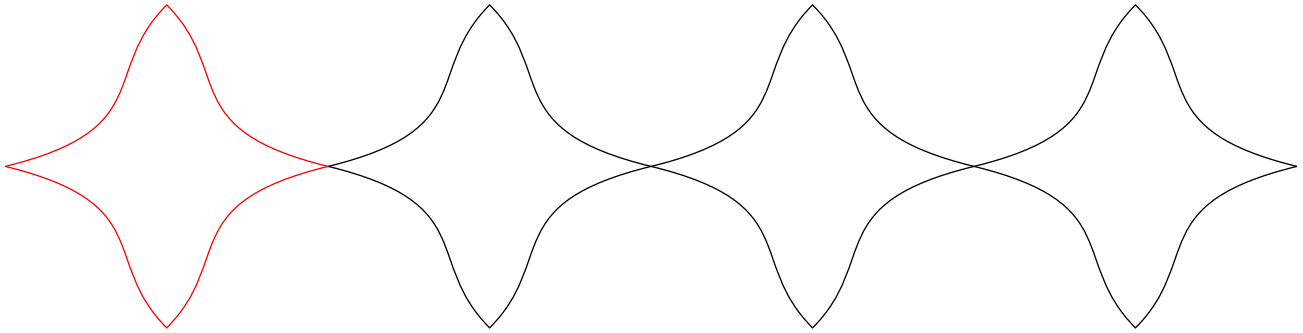
Mark a straight reference line through the centre of the block



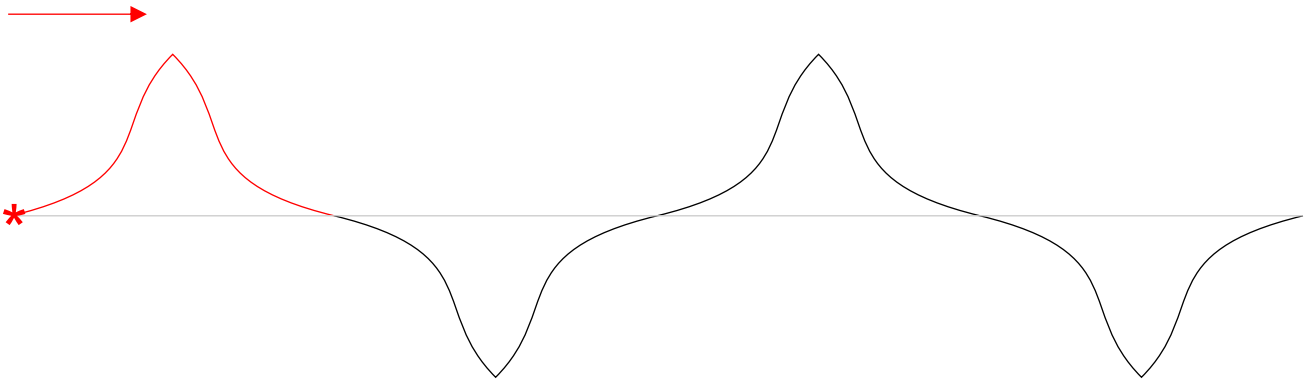
